## Scenario Facilitation Guide

### Goals of Scenario

LWM provides scenario as a learning extension opportunity for enhanced understanding of medical information and skills practice.

### Using This Guide

This guide is designed as a resource to set up successful scenarios. Each scenario provided by LWM is detailed on a scenario worksheet. All necessary details for the scenario are included in the sheet. The first section outlines the participant:rescuer ratio, the recommended level of training that participants have to participate, and the objectives of the specific scenario.

The Critical Action section details the actions that will be taken by a rescuer in order to successfully complete the scenario. Remaining part of the sheet provides information necessary to successfully set the scenario up with participants. Information is broken up between information given to rescuers and information given to patients.

Successful scenario set up involves equal preparation of both rescuers and patients. Patients need specific information about their condition, including back story, current vital signs, and specific response to treatment (or lack of treatment). Rescuers are set up with information regarding the environment or unobservable features of the scene. Rescuers may also be given about the scenario end state and what they need to complete in order to complete the tasks required of the scenario.

Information regarding facilitator participation (if any) is also included in each scenario.

### Set Up

Plan on approximately 5-10 minutes of total set up for both patients and responders.

#### *Patients*

- Provide back story
- Provide information from focused exam. Depending on the complexity of the scenario, patients may need to hear the information more than once.

#### *Responders*

- Provide appropriate back story information
- Provide expectations for scenario completion

#### *Facilitators*

- Roam between groups during the scenario to provide in the moment feedback based on observations
- If necessary, proctor any necessary patient signs/symptoms or environmental concerns if not provided by the patient

### Debrief

The debrief provides the opportunity for participants to process the information gained during scenario. Without debrief, participants may miss out on important lessons from the experience.
