Who We Are:

Longleaf Wilderness Medicine is a small team of experienced educators committed to facilitating high-quality, research-based wilderness medicine education. We offer courses for local and federal government agencies, expedition guides, wilderness instructors, remote travelers, and those interested in being more prepared for natural disasters or medical emergencies.

Position Description: Full-Time, 10-Month Position:

Instructors deliver Longleaf Wilderness Medicine curricula in classrooms across the United States. The position requires frequent travel via car and airplane.

LWM seeks a motivated educator to fill a full-time seasonal (10-month) instructor position. The annual contract runs from January-June and September-December.

LWM instructors can expect to deliver the following course types with program lengths varying from a half-day to 9 in-person days:

- Wilderness First Responder
- Wilderness First Responder Recertification
- Wilderness First Aid
- First Aid for Remote Industry
- CPR



Responsibilities:

Longleaf Wilderness Medicine instructors have course responsibilities that begin before students arrive at class and end after they leave. During courses, instructors can expect to work at least 10 hours per day, with the potential of evening work depending on the course type. Full-time instructors also support the delivery of courses through administrative work.

General Responsibilities

- Arrive to all travel and class responsibilities on time and prepared to work
- Support the mission of LWM through professional client interactions and providing a quality educational experience
- Creating a professional, supportive learning environment for diverse student populations in a variety of classroom spaces
- Ability to be flexible in a dynamic work environment
- Identify and implement feedback for self and team and actively implement provided feedback

Course Instruction (75%)

- Teach LWM classes in line with the appropriate LWM curriculum for the class type, including lectures, skills demonstration, and providing feedback to students
- Safe management of LWM programming thorough, practical teaching and risk management during course facilitation
- Providing development-aimed feedback to co-instructors
- Developing Assistant Instructors, as appropriate

Administrative Duties (25%)

- Oversee student progress in online materials, including answering questions, grading assignments, and course material review
- Ensure completion of all required LWM course paperwork during in-person components of courses
- Ensuring completion of course logistics (equipment check in/check out, participant paperwork, and testing)

- Minimum of two years of teaching experience either in a classroom or outdoor education environment
- Experience developing, delivering, and improving lesson plans
- Experience teaching adult learners is preferred

- Experience leading or managing extended outdoor trips

• Experience in providing pre-hospital medical care (e.g., through EMS, search and rescue, ski patrol, or expedition)

- Higher medical certification with a valid wilderness-related certification
- Current CPR certification

- Valid US driving license and a driving record that allows car rental
- Must be able to travel, including commercial air travel
- Able to stand and walk on uneven terrain for extended periods
- Able to lift 50lbs
